

Standards of Conduct

KBA has high expectations for all of its students. Students must agree to abide by the school's Standards of Conduct as listed in the Parent-Student Handbook. Students who violate the Standards of Conduct may be asked to withdraw from KBA.

Uniforms

School uniforms are to be only purchased from the school approved uniform company. It is recommended that parents purchase at least two sets of uniforms. Please see the school office for brochures, order forms, and current prices. Uniforms are to be kept clean and neat in appearance.

Elementary Classroom Behavior

Every elementary teacher at KBA is expected to use appropriate classroom management principles to ensure that proper classroom decorum is maintained. This involves correcting behavior problems before they become disruptive, establishing and enforcing clear classroom rules and working with parents to change undesirable behavior.

Parental Support

Every parent wants to support his child. One of the best ways you can support your child is by supporting your child's school in matters of discipline. We are on you and your child's side and only desire to see your child succeed academically, spiritually, and socially. If your child continually misbehaves in class or violates the school's General Standards of Conduct, then he will be sent to the office. In serious cases, you will be notified and asked to discipline your child. If the child is repeatedly sent to the office and your discipline efforts are ineffective, then you may be asked to withdraw your child from school.

Lunch

Students in grades K-12 will need to bring home lunch or purchase lunch directly from the lunch vendor. A snack shop is also available for grades 7-12 which sells microwaveable food items. A price list is available from the office.

Field Trips

During the school year, the students will go on excursions or have activities which will necessitate transportation and/or admission charges. Parents are always welcome to help as chaperones, but non-school children are not permitted. Field trips that are educational in nature are not optional; they are part of the learning experience at KBA.
